Day 1 – 2nd September 2018 Arrival in Malta

Welcome to Malta! This is the land of my parents. I am excited to share this amazing island with you.

Upon arrival at the airport, you will be met and transferred to your hotel. The remainder of the day is yours at leisure to relax. Welcome drinks (not included) will take place this evening to meet your fellow travellers.





Day 2 – 3rd September 2018 Valletta

Today it is time to explore the capital city of Valletta. This tour will take you through the bustling streets of Valletta allowing you to view the Baracca Gardens that command a breathtaking panorama of the Grand Harbour and then to St. John's Cathedral, adorned in riches that date back to the Knights of Malta including the world famous Caravaggio painting that is on display in the Oratory of this Cathedral. Included is also a visit of the Grand Master's Palace which includes the state rooms, as well as a visit to The Archaeological museum. Time permitting, you may also visit the ANZAC Memorial at Argotti Gardens. Lunch today is at Eddie's Café.

If you still have any energy left, walk around the back streets behind the hotel. Lots of narrow streets with some authentic homes still there.

Or Walk like a Maltese and do the passigata along the promenade Or have a swim and cool down!

Dinner this evening is all about Maltese specialities. Gululu is a casual diner, serving both traditional and contemporary Maltese food in a relaxed atmosphere on the sea shore in pretty Spinola bay. Gululu is a good place for a true taste of Malta. During the warmer months a good selection of fish is always

Day 3 – 4th September 2018 Gozo

The Gozo Land Rover Safari is probably the best way to see the island of Gozo, where we take you to all the places of interest that our sister island has to offer and drive through beautiful countryside and valleys, taking different routes from your 'normal' excursions. You will be collected from your accommodation from 7:00am onwards and taken to the Jeep Safari Terminal (departure point) from where the Safari departs for the Gozo Ferry. Upon arrival in Gozo, we will start our Safari to discover the magical island of Calypso. We drive to the village of Qala and then on to Nadur, down to the red sandy beach of Ramla I-Hamra (Ramla Bay) and then on to the very quaint village of Xagħra. Lunch today will be in a local farm house. After lunch we head off for Marsalforn which is a very popular tourist town and then on to Dwejra the'Inland Sea'. During this excursion, we will also visit Ggantija temples – two Megalithic temples – considered to be one of the earliest free standing constructions in the world, the citadel in the capital city of Victoria, the Bay of Xlendi, Azur Window and inland sea at Dwejra. From here we head to the Fishing Village of Xlendi and then back to the ferry. We will return to the Safari Terminal at approximately 6:00pm when you will be collected once again to be taken back to your accommodation. (B,L)

Day 4 – 5th September 2018 The Three cities

Join me and wander through amazing streets untouched by Tourism

I will be leading you to the Three cities. It's an amazing part of Malta. We will catch the local bus.

The Three Cities offer an intriguing insight into Malta and its history. These cities are a slice of authentic life as well as a glimpse into Malta's maritime fortunes. Along with Mdina it is the oldest fortified city in Malta.

The harbour inlets have been in use since Phoenician times: the docks always providing a living for local people, but also leaving them vulnerable when Malta's rulers were at war. As the first home to the **Knights of St. John**, the Three Cities' palaces, churches, forts and bastions are far older than Valletta's.

We will pass through narrow medieval streets and coastal footpaths.





We will also visit the *Malta at War Museum* where you will be able to enter the underground war shelters of World War II. There will be some free time to have lunch in the Victory Square and visit the Inquisitors Palace.

The walk will conclude at the fort alongside the marina where you can then get the ferry across to Valetta and have the most amazing view at Baracca Gardens. You can either stay in Valetta or get the ferry or bus home.

Bring your walking shoes! Entry fees and lunch at your own expense (B)

Day 5 – 6th September 2018 Marsaxlokk, Tarxien, Ghar Dalam & Hal Saflini Hypogeum

Discover the southern part of Malta visiting the picturesque fishing Village of Marsaxlokk. Tarxien Temples is a group of three temples that due to their very good state of preservation provided plentiful evidence of the skill and artistic abilities of our forefathers. It dates from 3600 to 2500 BC and is the most complex of all temple sites in Malta. It consists of four megalithic structures. We also visit Tas Silg which are a pair of temples that contain ruins from 3 different eras. A visit through the cave and museum of Ghar Dalam, one of the first habitats of these Islands is also included. The highlight of this day is a visit to the world-renowned Hal Saflieni Hypogeum This truly unique site enjoys an individual listing on the UNESCO World Heritage Sites. The Hypogeum consists of halls, chambers and passages hewn out of the living rock and covering some 500m². The rock-cut chambers are of a diverse shapes and sizes and finished to different standards of workmanship. The complex is grouped in three levels – the upper level (3600-3300 BC), the middle level (3300-3000 BC), and the lower level (3150 -2500 BC). The deepest room in the lower level is 10.6 metres under road surface. The site was discovered accidentally by a stone mason in 1902. Please note that restricted viewing at Hypogeum applies. Only 10 persons per hour can go in so tickets must be purchased well in advance. We will rotate the groups so half visit the Hypogeum whilst the other half explore Tarxien Temple. The group will meet for lunch at leisure. (B)

Day 6 – 7th September 2018 Golden Sands and Festa

Today is yours at leisure to relax and explore independently.

Lots to do.

Take the ferry to Valetta and wonder around. Walk or catch a bus up to the Point – a new shopping centre with a courtyard with lots of places to eat. Walk down the street and find the shops.

But save some energy for the afternoon walk. Transfers will be provided for you to Golden Sands. We will spend some time exploring Gold Sands where we will be led by a local who will show us the great views of this area. Pack a picnic/ Champers? You will be collected and transferred to Melieha Festival. Stay and watch the fireworks and then transfer back later in the evening. (B)

Day 7 – 8th September 2018 Mosta, Mdina, Rabat and Skorba & Ta Hagrat

A visit to Mosta Church, Europe's third largest free standing dome and Mdina, Malta's old capital city for a short walk in the 'silent city' admiring the imposing bastions that command a magnificent view and allow us to admire a panorama of most of the island. Included in this tour is a visit to Skorba Temples a typical three-apsed temple that was built in the Ggantija phase (3600 - 3200BC). Remains include the stone paving of the entrance passage, the torba floors of the apses, a 3.90 metre high slab of coralline limestone, and steps covered with pitted decoration. Ta Hagrat Temples is one of the earliest





temple buildings in Malta. The temple is smaller than many of the Islands' temples, at 15m long internally, but it is better preserved. In Rabat we also visit the Roman Villa (Domus Romana) with its mosaic pavements that rank amongst the finest and oldest compositions from the western Mediterranean and St. Paul's catacombs. (B) **Note this day should end in Mdina with an option for the group to return to the hotel with the vehicle or to make their own way via public transport.

Day 8 – 9th September 2018 Prehistoric sites, Limestone Heritage & typical fishing village

Depart for a full day tour to the South (including Temples & Limestone Heritage). We explore one of Malta's unspoilt typical villages. Together with the guide you will be led to a Maltese Pjazza (square) along winding narrow streets where progress did not leave it's mark We proceed to the temples Hagar Qim & Mnajdra temples (3600 BC). These temples stand on a hilltop and offer a breathtaking view of the sea and the islet of Filfla. We then proceed to Wied iz – Zurrieq where there we have the possibility to take a boat trip that will take you to the Blue Grotto renowned for its azure sea. After lunch we proceed to the beautiful cliffs at Dingli. We also visit the Limestone Heritage which is a modernised quarry that explains Malta's foremost trade of quarrying together with farmhouse building and stone decoration always using the typical limestone. (B,L)

Day 9 - 10th September 2018 Sailing

Spend the day on the water sailing around in a private Luzzo as you explore Malta, Gozo and Comino. With plenty of time for swimming, enjoy a Maltese lunch of traditional foods like Hobs bi zejt, maltese platter, and baked macaroni on board. (B,L)

Day 10 – 11th September 2018 Day at leisure, Farewell Dinner.

Today is at leisure.

This evening enjoy a farewell dinner Ta Cassia Salina. (B,D)

Day 11 – 12th September 2018 Departure

Following breakfast, the day is yours at leisure until it is time to transfer to the airport for your onward flight. (B).
