Day 1 [Thurs 20 Feb 14]: Arrival Hanoi (with guide)

Upon arrival, a guide is waiting to transfer guests to the hotel.

Day 2 [Fri 21 Feb 14]: Hanoi – Lao Cai

Sapa is a former French hill station set in a high valley near the Vietnam-China border and is surrounded by picturesque mountains. At 1600m, its cool climate inspired the French to build villas here as their summer retreat from Hanoi. Today, Sapa attracts visitors from around the world due to its stunning scenery, crisp climate, colourful markets and ethnic hill tribes living in nearby villages.



Board an overnight train from Hanoi to the border town of Lao Cai.

Catch some sleep along the way in soft sleeper berths on the express train (4 berth shared cabins). The train departs around 21:00pm and arrives into Lao Cai the following day at around 06:00am.

Day 3 Sat 22 Feb 14]: Lao Cai - Sapa (B, L)

Early arrive at Lao Cai, transfer to Sapa for breakfast. Today you start by getting some exercise with trek to the hill tribe villages of Cat Cat, Ta Van and Cau May. As you walk to the villages nestled in the valley below Sapa, you will meet some of the local ethnic minority people on their way to and from Sapa. These minority people, including the Red Zao, Hmong and Tay people, walk to Sapa to trade at the markets. Tonight you spend the night at the hotel in Sapa town.

Day 4 [Sun 23 Feb 14]: Sapa – Ta Phin – Lao Cai (B)

This morning our exercise involves climbing up Ham Rong Mountain for a panoramic view of Sapa and its environs. After lunch time we drive out of town and commence an hour-long walk to Ta Phin, home to the distinctive Dao (pronounced Zao) community. From here we drive to Lao Cai station for the overnight train journey to Hanoi.

Catch some sleep along the way in soft sleeper berths on the express train (4 berth shared cabins). The train departs around 20:00pm and arrives into Hanoi the following day at around 05:00am.

Day 5 [Mon 24 Feb 14]: Train back to Hanoi (B)

Upon arrival in Hanoi, transfer directly to the hotel for breakfast and a freshen up before heading to Halong Bay.

In the morning, drive to Halong Bay (3.5 hours), with a refreshment break en route. Board 'Paradise' junk on Tuan Chau Island and meet the crew. Enjoy a welcome cocktail and Asian buffet lunch while admiring the beautiful bay scenery. Spend the day cruising around the UNESCO heritage-listed bay.

Go kayaking or swimming (weather permitting) or relax on the sundeck and enjoy the sunset over the islands as the boat arrives at its anchorage for the evening. Discover the secrets of Vietnamese cuisine with the cooking demonstration. Dinner is a freshly prepared seafood feast and the evening entertainment includes movies, board games or spa treatments.

Day 6 [Tues 25 Feb 14]: Halong Bay – Hanoi (Paradise Cruise) (B)

Awake to morning tai chi and a buffet breakfast and cruise to Ti Top - one of the most beautiful beaches of the bay. Climb 400 steps up to the top of the island and capture a breathtaking panoramic view of the bay before cruising back to Tuan Chau Island, arriving at 10.30am. Meet up with the vehicle for the drive back to Hanoi, arriving at 14:30pm.

Day 7 [Wed26 Feb 14]: Hanoi - flight to Hoi An (B)

This morning, we visit the Ho Chi Minh Mausoleum (open in the morning only and closed Mondays and Fridays), his Former Residence and Temple of Literature - the first University and the capital of Vietnam about 1000 years ago.

Then we visit the Vietnam History Museum (closed on Monday/Friday) before you have the rest of the afternoon free at leisure

This afternoon, transfer to the airport in Hanoi. Take a flight to Danang. Upon arrival, transfers are provided to the hotel. Balance of the day at leisure, for own arrangements.

Day 8 [Thurs 27 Feb 14]: Hoi An cooking class at Red Bridge (B, L)



Hoi An food is markedly different to that of the north and south and has a number of very popular specialities. Interact with local sellers at the outdoor markets and purchase ingredients for the cooking class, before cruising down the Thu Bon River to the cooking school for an engaging hands-on lesson with the chef. At the completion of the class sit and enjoy a delicious lunch, including what you have just prepared.

Day 9 [Fir 28 Feb 14]: Hoi An Farmer and Fisherman (B, L)

This exciting full day tour gives you an insight into the lives of the farming and fishing communities in this beautiful region of Vietnam. Begin your adventure by cycling out into the countryside through emerald green rice paddies. After a short ride you will arrive at the village of Tra Que. This charming little settlement, on the edge of Hoi An, is famous for its sweet scented green vegetables that spice up Hoi An's famous delicacies such Cao Lau and Mi Quang. On arrival you will be introduced to the history of the village and the cultivation of the vegetables. Continue with a walk around the vegetable garden and join the farmers in preparing the land and planting some crops. Finish off your village experience with a fun cooking demonstration. Later, return to Hoi An and board the Eco Tour boat for a river cruise to meet and engage with local fisherman. You are sure to enjoy the hands on experience of river net fishing with the locals. Next, you have the opportunity to paddle a unique bamboo basket boat, known as a coracle, as you explore the area's coconut palmed waterways. **Option to drive instead of cycle is included

This afternoon take a half day city tour of Ho Chi Minh City.

Ho Chi Minh City, or Saigon as the city is still frequently referred to, is Vietnam's largest city. It is a fast-paced metropolis full of contrasts, with street vendors selling fruit and vegetables next to glitzy western-style bars and boutiques. Amazingly, the city's history dates back only 300 years. In 1859 the city was captured by the French and became the capital of Cochin China. From 1956



until April 1975 it was the capital of the US-backed Republic of Vietnam. Today, Ho Chi Minh City is very much the heart of Vietnamese business and entrepreneurial activity. The French left their mark with some fine colonial-era buildings such as the Notre Dame Cathedral and the Central Post Office.

- The Notre Dame Cathedral and Old Post Office: Built between 1877 and 1883 this is one of the best examples of classical French colonial architecture. Remarkably every stone used in its creation was shipped from France to Vietnam. Her two forty metre towers, topped with iron spires, still dominate the city's skyline. The Old Post Office is another example of French colonial architecture and is also the country's largest post office.
- Dong Khoi Street, the Opera House and the Peoples' Committee Building: built in 1897 by French architect Ferret Eugene, the 800 seat Opera House was used as the home of the Lower House Assembly of Sourth Vietnam after 1956. It was not until 1975 that it was again used for performances. The structure was restored in 1995. The Opera House is located on the historical Dong Khoi Street which is home to many boutiques and fine restaurants. Just around the corner are the iconic Rex hotel and the beautiful Peoples' Committee Building.

• The Reunification Palace: This is one of the most important buildings in the city. Here on April 30th 1975 the 'American War' officially ended when tank number 843 of the North Vietnamese Army crashed through the gates of what was, at the time the residence of the President of the Republic of Vietnam.



• **The War Remnants Museum**: Formerly known as the Museum of American War Crimes, this is a poignant display of the futility of war. Some of the black and white photography in the 'Requiem' exhibit is particularly touching, dedicated to both foreign and Vietnamese journalists and photographers who perished during the conflict. The courtyard outside contains the spoils of war, namely rusting jets, tanks and cannons captured from the American military machine.

Please note: Some of the images on display at the War Remnants Museum can be confronting and may not be suitable for small children.

Day 11 [Sun 02 Mar 14]: Ho Chi Minh City – Vinh Long Homestay (B, L, D)

Depart at 08:00am from the hotel. The morning begins with a drive through the Mekong Delta to the town of Cai Be, famous for its floating markets. After touring the markets, board a private boat and cruise along the maze of waterways and canals to Vinh Long. Here, feast at the home of a Bonsai gardener for a sumptuous Delta lunch, including the popular 'Elephant ear fish', before continuing to explore the tributaries and canals of the Delta. Towards the end of the day, arrive at the home of a local family. The evening is spent with the family, learning about life in the Delta.

Day 12 [Mon 03 Mar 14]: Vinh Long – Ho Chi Minh City (B, L)

Rising to the sounds of life on the Delta, have an early breakfast before boarding a riverboat to cruise to Vinh Long town, stopping along the way to visit local cottage industries. Then, transfer by vehicle to the town of My Tho to visit the Vinh Trang pagoda, before returning to Ho Chi Minh City.

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Day 13 [Tues 04 Mar 14]: Ho Chi Minh City – Cu Chi Tunnels by Saigon River Group Tours (River - Road) Itinerary day by day - full descriptions

Be picked up from your hotel at around 7.30am.

Transfer by vehicle to Ho Chi Minh Pier where you will start your journey by speedboat to Cu Chi Tunnels. Cruise the Saigon River, taking in the scenery and river life as you leave the bustling city behind.

Upon arrival, at around 9.30am, you'll watch a short introductory video on the construction of the tunnels and life there during the Vietnam War (known locally as the 'American War').

This immense network of tunnels was the location of several military campaigns during the war and served as a base for operations for the Tet Offensive in 1968. The tunnels served as communication and supply routes, living quarters, hospitals and food and weapon stores for numerous guerilla fighters, and were crucial to the resistance to American forces, ultimately helping the Vietnamese forces to achieve

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military success.

More than just a historical site, the Cu Chi tunnels are testimony to the resilience of the Vietnamese people through the Vietnam War.

After your visit to the tunnels, drive through the countryside to visit a cricket farm. Crickets are considered a delicacy by many Vietnamese and it's believed that hungry soldiers in the area during wartime discovered the edible value of crickets when they ran out of more conventional foodstuffs.

At the farm you'll see crickets in various stages of growth and can see them being prepared as food should you wish to. There's also the opportunity to sample a cricket-based dish either on at the onsite restaurant or as a takeaway.

Returning to Ho Chi Minh City, stop for a traditional Vietnamese lunch (not including cricket).

You'll arrive back at your hotel between 2.20pm and 3pm.

- 14-60 days before arrival: 35% of the price
- 13 days before arrival: 100% of the price

The above excludes certain classes of domestic air tickets (i.e.: M class). These must be paid by Buffalo Tours at time of booking and are thus non-refundable.

Claims and Refunds of Unused Services
