Day 1 [Sat 01 Nov 14]: Arrival Ho Chi Minh City (with guide)

Day 2 [Sun 02 Nov 14]: Ho Chi Minh City - Half day city tour (B)

Your guide will meet you at your hotel around 8am and driven to the city's Central Post Office, which was designed by the renowned French architect Gustav Eiffel, and Notre Dame Cathedral, the iconic landmark built between 1863 and 1880. Admired for its neo-Romanesque architecture, the cathedral is a popular backdrop for local wedding photographers.

Next, stroll toward the Saigon River along Dong Khoi Street, which figured prominently in Graham Greene's famous Vietnam novel, *The Quiet American*, to the Saigon Opera House, a commanding building completed in 1901. Shelled during World War II, it was used to shelter French citizens fleeing North Vietnam in 1954, the year Vietnam earned its independence from France.



The tour continues with a stop at the Reunification Palace, where a North Vietnamese tank crashed through the gates in 1975 to end a war that killed an estimated 58,000 Americans and three million Vietnamese. You will also visit the War Remnants Museum, where Vietnam's government has assembled presentations - some of them graphic - of wartime hardships and atrocities

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Day 3 [Mon 03 Nov 14]: Ho Chi Minh City – Can Tho (B, L)

The morning begins with a drive through the Mekong Delta to the town of Cai Be, famous for its floating markets. After touring the markets, board a private boat and cruise along the maze of waterways and canals to Vinh Long, where lunch is served in a local orchard. Afterwards, drive to the city of Can Tho, the economic hub of the Mekong Delta, and spend the night at a hotel.

Day 4 [Tue 04 Nov 14]: Can Tho – Ho Chi Minh City (B, L)

In the morning, take a boat to visit Cai Rang floating market and fruit gardens in Can Tho. The tour then returns to Ho Chi Minh City.

Day 5 [Wed 05 Nov 14]: Ho Chi Minh City – Half day Cu Chi tunnels - Fly to Danang (B)

Begin your journey to the Cu Chi Tunnels by departing at around 8am from your hotel and travel through the countryside which was once a stronghold of the Viet Cong. Upon arrival, watch a short video about what life was like for soldiers who lived there during the war. The cramped tunnels were central to a few of the war's strategic operations, including the famous 1968 Tet Offensive, and they didn't escape damage. American B52 bombers dropped hundreds of missiles leaving huge tell-tale craters behind. The tunnels served not only as living quarters, but as supply routes and hospitals for thousands of guerilla fighters. Many died there from malaria and other diseases, and a few were also born or married. Today they are viewed by some as a testimony to the Vietnamese people's resiliency.

Return to Ho Chi Minh City around 2pm

Day 6 [Thu 06 Nov 14]: Hoi An Full day tour (B, L)

Depart at approx. 08:30am from the hotel.

From the 16th to 18th centuries, Hoi An was a thriving international commercial port for Chinese, Dutch, French, Japanese, Portuguese and Arab merchants. Today, Hoi An is a quaint riverside town, renowned for its silk and popular with tourists for its eclectic architecture, tailors shops and numerous



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cafes. Some of the buildings in the narrow streets have remained unchanged for more than a century and much of the town is now heritage-listed.

Enjoy a half day walking tour through the narrow winding streets of the Ancient Quarter visiting Chua Ong Pagoda, Assembly Hall, 200-year-old Tam Ky house and the Japanese Covered Bridge. After lunch, there is a short boat trip to visit a handcraft ceramic village and boat building yards.

Day 9 [Sun 09 Nov 14]: Hoi An - Hue (B)

This morning continue north to the Imperial city of Hue. The five hour trip hugs the coastline along the South China Sea with breathtaking views particularly as the road winds its way up Hai Van Pass ("Pass of the Clouds").

Upon arrival into Hue, check in to the hotel.

Day 10 [Mon 10 Nov 14]: Hue City Tour (B, L)

Hue was the Vietnamese capital during the Nguyen Dynasty 1802-1945 and ruins of the city's regal past can still be seen inside the Citadel and the Imperial City. Created in the 19th century, the Imperial City was modelled on the Forbidden City in Beijing and holds many palaces and temples inside its giant walls. Many of the buildings were damaged by French aerial bombing and the Tet Offensive in 1968. Now it is slowly being restored thanks to generous funding by UNESCO.

The tour begins after breakfast with the ancient walled Citadel containing the former Imperial Palace. Spend the morning wandering through the enclosure before lunch and a trip into the surrounding countryside to see the final resting place of the Emperors at two of the most impressive Royal Tombs. In the evening, there is a cruise along the Perfume River.

Day 12 [Wed 12 Nov 14]: Hanoi - Halong (B, L, D)

This morning depart from Hanoi and drive to Halong Bay (approximately three hours), where the Bhaya, a traditional wooden junk will be waiting. Halong Bay is a UNESCO World Heritage Site made up of almost 2,000 islands of varying sizes emerging from emerald green waters.

Spend the afternoon sailing the bay, stopping to explore the limestone formations in the Cave of Surprises and visit a local fishing village. You'll have plenty of time to swim, kayak or relax onboard with a massage, before the sun sets and a delicious Vietnamese buffet dinner is served under the stars.

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Day 13 [Thu 13 Nov 14]: Halong (B, L, D)

Awake with the early morning sun and start your day with a lesson in Tai Chi. Reward your efforts with hearty breakfast before jumping aboard the Little Bhaya to cruise to the outer reaches of Halong Bay. Anchor at the pristine Lan Ha Bay with its many secluded bays and inlets. Explore hidden sea caves and grottoes by kayak or relax on a white sandy beach. Continue to the island of Ho Ba Ham for more stunning scenery and areas to discover, before returning to the main Bhaya vessel in time for a sunset drink on the deck and dinner.

Day 14 [Fri 14 Nov 14]: Halong - Hanoi - Overnight train to Sapa (B)

This morning you will cruise back to the main port arriving mid-morning and then transfer to Hanoi.

Pick up at 20.00pm from your hotel for overnight train to Sapa.

Day 15 [Sat 15 Nov 14]: Lao Cai - Can Cau market - Sapa (B, L)

Early arrive at Lao Cai, enjoy breakfast at local restaurant then start for Can Cau market trip

Held every Saturday, the Can Cau market sees a mix of Flower H'mong, Black Dao, Phu La as well as Chinese day trippers that cross the border to shop. It offers fantastic photo opportunities of the minority people in traditional dress and lots embroidered bags, belts, scarves and other handicrafts are for sale. After visiting the market, travel about 20km to Bac Ha village where you will have lunch and then take a short walk to a Tay village where the houses are built on stilts. Enjoy an oxcart ride around the village or if the water levels are high, cruise along the Chay River and take in the scenery.

Day 16 [Sun 16 Nov 14]: Sapa - Bac Ha market - Sapa (B, L)

You will be met and driver at 8:00 AM then start our drive to Bac Ha town. The road is relatively flat from Lao Cai to Bao Nhai Bridge. After crossing the bridge, we begin our journey up to Bac Ha. Bac Ha market, located in the heart of Bac ha small town is the largest one in the area. Every Sunday, the different and colorful ethnic minority come all here to sell their homemade products or buy something for the family. They are Hmong, Phu La, Black Dzao, Tay or Nung minorities. Some of these ethnic minorities can't be met in any other areas. Your lunch will be provided in a local restaurant.

In the afternoon, we drive downhill towards Lao Cai for about half an hour. We stop on the way (before reaching Lao Cai) to take a short walk to Trung Do village inhabited by Tay people. Tay villages are



always set up at the foot of a mountain or along a stream and are named after a mountain, a field, or a

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river. Each village contains about 15-20 households. A large village is divided into many small hamlets. The houses are built on stilts or level with the ground. Stop by a traditional Tay house for a cup of tea before taking a boat cruise upstream the Chay River. The scenery is very beautiful on both sides of the river. The boat trip will end at Bao Nhai Bridge where your vehicle will be waiting for you for the journey back to Sapa.

Day 17 [Mon 17 Nov 14]: Sapa – Ta Phin – Lao Cai (B)

Morning free at leisure. After lunch time we drive out of town to Ta Phin, home to the distinctive Dao (pronounced Zao) community. From here we drive to Lao Cai station for the overnight train journey to Hanoi.

Catch some sleep along the way in soft sleeper berths on the express train (deluxe 2 berths private cabins). The train departs around 20:00pm and arrives into Hanoi the following day at around 05:00am.

Day 18 [Tue 18 Nov 14]: Hanoi half day street food - evening tour (B)

Arrive Hanoi early in the morning, transfer to hotel for early check in (Silk Path hotel). Own transfer to Sofitel Metropole Hotel around noon time

5.30pm: You will start your evening with an introduction to the tour from your guide before heading to 'bia hoi corner' where you can try the local brew while you watch the busy streets of Hanoi's Old Quarter. Bia Hoi is a draft beer that is brewed daily and usually drunk by locals sat on small plastic stools. Continue on through the bustling old quarter and listen as your guide tells you about the various foods on offer. Stop and try some samples before you head for a Vietnamese style barbeque dinner. Here your guide will select an array meats, tofu and vegetables on skewers while you sit down as they flame grill the food for you.



Walk a little more along the streets and then along the Hoan Kiem lake for dessert. On the way, admire the energetic ladies sharing a public aerobic class. Your final stop is at Hanoi's most famous ice-cream street. An unforgettable experience shared with scores of young Hanoians. Talk to any Hanoian, they all love the place!

Please note: In case of heavy rain the itinerary may be altered to visit a covered local noodle stall.

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Day 19 [Wed 19 Nov 14]: Hanoi - Story of Hanoi City Tour (B, L)

This morning you will be picked up from your hotel between 8 and 8.30am and driven to the Ho Chi Minh Complex where your guide will tell you all about the history of Ho Chi Minh. The complex contains a number of relics from Ho Chi Minh's time as president from 1954-1979 as well as his former stilt house residence and the presidential palace. From the complex continue on and walk a short distance to the archaeological site of the central sector of the Imperial Citadel of Thang Long.

The Citadel was built in the 11th century by the Ly Viet Dynasty and was the centre of regional political power for almost 13 centuries without interruption. To understand better this World Cultural Heritage, you will visit the excavation area where intensive research is in progress. Follow this with a visit to the remaining Citadel, standing proudly with many buildings in very good condition. Check the quaint little museum hidden on the premises, full of interesting artifacts collected through the ages. Continue on to Cua Bac, the Northern gate of the Citadel, and see how the citadel resisted the French cannons. Board your vehicle and drive to the lovely restaurant where lunch will be served.

After lunch visit the Temple of Literature, Hanoi's first university. Originally built as a temple dedicated to Confucius, it became the site of Vietnam's first university dating back to 1070. Inside are the stone steles mounted on the backs of turtles, engraved with the names of the university's graduates. The complex is divided into five courtyards with different paths that would originally have been reserved for the Emperor and his mandarins. One of the courtyards contains the statue of Confucius guarded by two beautiful bronze storks standing on turtles. The temple highlights the importance that Vietnamese society placed on education.



From the Temple of Literature you will be transferred by vehicle to Hanoi's Old Quarter where you will visit Long Bien Bridge. Constructed from 1899 - 1902 whilst Vietnam was under French occupancy, Long Bien Bridge crosses the Red River. Your guide will tell you the story of the bridge and take you across to the other side where you can see how close Hanoi is to countryside life.



Next take a 30 minute cyclo tour through the Old Quarter. A cyclo (pronounced see-clo) is a Vietnamese version of a cycle rickshaw, originally used as the main form of transportation in Vietnam. The Old Quarter, also known as the 36 streets, is a bustling area of narrow streets home to literally thousands of small businesses, shopkeepers and street vendors, selling everything from bananas to books. Originally each of the 36 street names was related to the products being sold there. For instance you can walk from Fish Street to Tin Street to Bamboo Street. We will provide you with a map for the tour so you can spot the sights along the way.

Finally end your day with a Vietnamese coffee in a local café overlooking Hoan Kiem Lake. Here you can spend some quality time with your guide and ask him questions about all the sights you have seen throughout the day. You will return to your hotel at 4.30pm.

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Please note: On Mondays and Fridays some of the Ho Chi Minh City Complex and Imperial Citadel of Thang Long will be closed and so there will be a slight change to the schedule. On these days these sites will be replaced with a visit to the Fine Arts Museum.

Day 21 [Fri 21 Nov 14]: Siem Reap Full Day Temple Tour (B, L)

This is a one day private classic tour of Angkor Wat and other important temples and ruins surrounding Siem Reap. The day begins at the South Gate of Angkor Thom, where you will begin your exploration of the centerpiece of this ancient city, the Bayon. The Bayon holds 54 towers decorated with more than 200 enigmatically smiling stone faces. The morning tour also visits the Royal Enclosure, Phimeanakas, the Terrace of Elephants and Terrace of Leper Kings, as well as Ta Prohm Temple, famously featured in the movie, Tomb Raider.



Afterwards, enjoy a relaxed lunch in Siem Reap before heading to the famous Angkor Wat - the best preserved of all the Angkor temples. There is ample time for a thorough exploration of this huge architectural wonder before climbing to the top of ancient Pre Rup temple to watch the sunset over the jungle.

Day 22 [Sat 22 Nov 14]: Siem Reap - Community Village Tour - One Day (B, L)

The tour visits a local community who are benefiting from small numbers of tourists who visit their village and experience traditional local life. Funds from your tour go directly to the families providing the services, as well as a portion which is donated to the community fund. Witness and participate in the village's daily life activities which vary according to the season.

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Depart from your hotel after breakfast and drive approximately 40 kms to the local community. You will stop along the way at an NGO providing employment to local women by weaving mats and other products. Continue to the edge of the village where you are met by a local guide and take an ox cart through the village. As you go through the village you will witness local rural life where ever you look. The ox cart journey concludes at the home of a local family, who will show you how to make brooms from natural materials. These materials are collected once per year and kept to make the brooms throughout the year. The whole family is usually taught how to make them. Continue through the village on foot while your local guide advises what activities are taking place and you may wish to join in. Depending on the season these activities may include rice planting or harvesting, vegetable planting or harvesting, taking animals to fields and fishing. Lunch will be provided by a local family and is a simple but enjoyable Khmer meal served family style.

Following lunch you may see how sugar palm is made (Dec- Apr) or continue with local activities. Before returning to your hotel mid afternoon, you will stop at a local monastery and receive a traditional monk's blessing.
